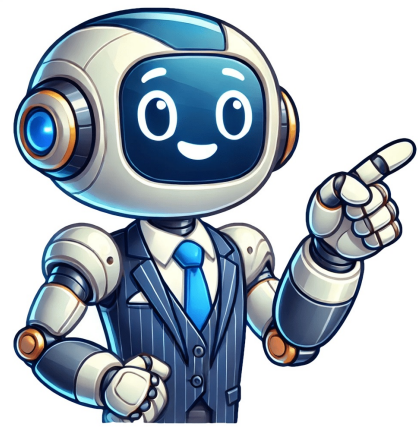

H. Qureshi being a Pakistani nationalist historian, has used the same approach as Indian nationalist historians use while writing nationalist history. Subsequently, this book tells us that Jinnah, Muslim League and other Pakistani nationalist leaders were always right. And Gandhi, Nehru, Patel and Congress were always wrong. Nationalist histories always give one perspective. That perspective might not be altogether wrong, but it's definitely incomplete. Things on the ground aren't that simple. History doesn't move in a linear direction. There are always ups and downs. And leaders might take some decisions with apparently contradict with their personalities but when you write this kind of nationalist histories, you have to ignore those contradictory approaches. Of course, you can't write a completely unbiased history but over-simplification doesn't do justice and might create the feelings of hatred towards other nations. When your nationalism stands on the pillar of hatred towards India, same would be the case with your nationalist history. This is an important book for its nationalistic context but not for historiography due to its tendencies of carving exclusionist and xenophobic impressions.It is also said that this book was allegedly ghost written by Khurshid Kamal Aziz, a renowned and prolific historian, who was a junior historian to Dr Qureshi for number of years. KK Aziz never minced words and openly revealed that secret in his book Murder of History. This obviously tarnished Qureshi's image as the father of Pakistani historiography. Regarding contents, this book is the narration of Muslim League's struggle against INC and Britishers for a separate homeland for Indian Muslims, with Quaid-i-Azam M Ali Jinnah as the central figure. That book enunciates Dec 22, 1939, as an important day for it put a seal on the Indian disunity.
