Some of these fans are still asking for a complete return of the final season of GoT. But we prefer to focus on another celebration: The Iron Anniversary, which marks the tenth anniversary of the debut of Games of Thrones on April 17, 2011. Coinciding with the occasion, HBO is launching the popular and political dragon filled show a month of celebration. And if all this doesn't sound pretty attractive, you'll always have the theater. Martin is working on the development of a Game of Thrones game for Broadway, which should launch in 2023. The show will include characters known as Ned Stark and Jaime Lannister and will be set during the Great Tourney in Harrenhal, a 10-day mistrust tournament that took place 16 years before the start of Game of Thrones. Now, she is an actress named emmy, a fanbase favorite of the show and is worth an estimated value of \$6 million. williams, whose real name is margaret, earns \$175,000 per episode; for the final season, eight episodes that will affect a cool \$1.4 million. in his time of shooting of game of thrones, appeared in several television series and British films, and in 2015, he raised his pop cred culture with a recurring role on the tetraction of peter capaldi of the long series of the bbc dr. who. entering the final season of game of thrones, a common chorus was "Don't let anything happen to Tormund," which goes to show how much the beloved portrait of kristofer hivju of the charismatic wildling tormund giantsbane has become since the adherence to the show in 2013. between his work on the hos show and a memorable role in the fate of the furious, it is estimated that the Norwegian actor worth almost \$6 million. hivju grew up in oslo, Norway and graduated from the acting school in 2004. one of his first major roles came in 2011 when he was launched as a research scientist in the prequel of the horror sci-fi the thing. since he was promoted to the main cast of game of thrones in 2014, hivju appeared on Norwegian drama success lilyhammer and starred beside charlize theron in the fairies of the furious. when he landed the role of the cold calculatorLena Headey was best known for her roles in the historic epic of Zak Snyder 300 and the Historic epic of Zak Snyder 300 and the Erritish actress a star worth a reported \$9 million. After being encouraged to audition for the show by his long-time friend Peter Dinklage, Headey got an estimated value agreement of \$300,000 per episode, and in 2014, renegotiated his contracts for the last two seasons to make \$500,000 an episode. He kept busy in his downtime from Game of Thrones with roles in movies such as The Purge and a voiceover part of the Netflix Trollhunters series. Few characters on Game of Thrones inspired as much devotion as Hodor, the gentle giant that protects Bran Stark after fleeing Winterfell. And although he is a man of few words (literally - the only word he knows is Hodor), Irish actor Kristian Nairn boasts of developing more than 70 ways to say the simple but powerful phrase. Nairn, who left the show in 2016, continued to act in shows like The Rookie, but is now focused on his DJ career, worth a note of \$500,000. Former resident DJ in Belfast travels around the world playing home progressively; in 2014 he paid tribute to the show with a Rave of Thrones tour that sold clubs throughout the country. Natalie Dormer has something for the tragic queens. The British actress obtained the first notice in 2007 as Anne Boleyn on The Tudors; then came Margaery Tyrell on Game of Thrones, who tried (and failed) to navigate the machines of Cersei Lannister. Since then he added the condemned ned stark to his list of memorable deaths. some actors have luck right outside the gate. even before joining game of thrones as ygritte, rose leslie had won a bafta and appeared in the first series of downton abbey. add its new role in the All-Access the good fight series, and leslie now worth \$4 million. Scottish actress appeared on game of thrones from 2012 to 2014 as ygritte, a wildling warrior who eventually fell in love with jon snow (and the actor who played it - leslie and haringtone married in 2018.) after leaving the show, she got roles in the last witch hunter and the detective idris elba luther series. was also in the good fight since 2017. The most shocking thing about conleth hill? Actually, it's not bald. The Northern Actor who plays the essay adviser of daenerys, varys, was obliged to shave his head during the shooting. is a small price to pay to play varys, the avid court spymaster known as master of whisperers, a role that contributed to make hill worthy of a reported \$2 million. Hill was already a well-known theatrical actor in Ireland who occasionally crossed television when it was recommended for the role of varys by no one over george r. martin himself. and working on game of thrones is a family relationship; the Hill's minor is an Emmy-winning sound engineer on the series. Although she was not known as co-star Sean BeanPeter Dinklage, Michelle Fairley, was one of the most veteran actors of the original cast of Game of Thrones. The Northern Irish actress has had over two decades worth theater, TV and film credits behind her, all adding up to a career is a reported \$3 million. Fairley portrayed Catelyn, the fiercely protective matriarch of the Stark family, for the first three seasons of the show. His last episode, The Rains of Castamere, is considered a high point (or low, depending on tolerance for violence) of the notoriously brutal series. Since then Fairley has appeared in recurring roles in TV shows such as Suits and 24: Live Another Day and has acted in a London revival of Julius Caesar. Like many of her co-stars, Sophie Turner had appeared in local games, but had never acted professionally before taking the role of Sansa, the major of Stark's daughters. Now, thanks to the success of HBO shows and other concerts, it is worth about \$6 million. Turner brings home only \$175,000 per episode, but that doesn't mean she's left tall and dry. The new Mrs Jonas (yes, married to Joe) has been awarded the role of Jean Grey in the new iteration of the X-Men franchise and has worked with brands like Wella Hair and Karen Millen. It's almost hard to believe that Jason Momoa was only on Game of Thrones for ten episodes, considering how his charismatic, intimidating leader Dothraki Khal Drogo still looms on big almost six seasons later. But for the actor and model of Hawaiian origin, it was only a stepping stone to become a superhero-certified superstar worth a reported \$14 million. Momoa had spent several seasons on the science fiction show Catapulted him into alevel of fame. After leaving the show in 2013, Momoa wrote, directed and starring in the film Road to toand landed a place in the DC Universe like Aquaman; his independent film in 2018 made over \$1 billion worldwide. Also in the world of books of George R. R. Martin, Brienne di Tarth stands out; is described as being unusually high and simple, a woman built to fight in a world that sees something as Aboriginal. Gwendoline Christie knew she was the perfect actress for the part and spoke her success in a reported career worth \$3 million. Christie, who is six feet three inches tall and cites Tilda Swinton as one of her inspirations, made her debut as the Brienne loyal in the second season of the show and quickly became a favorite fan. Outside of the HBO show, the British actress got roles in other important franchises such as The Hunger Games and Star Wars, where she plays the bad captain Phasma. Imagine the audition for your career's greatest work only three months after graduation from the Manchester School of Theatre when he came out for the role of Samwell Tarly on Game of Thrones. Now eight seasons later, Bradley is recognized worldwide and worth \$4 million. Bradley's only role before joining Game of Thrones was the epic drama I Borgia, where he portrayed Giovanni di Lorenzo de' Medici for half a dozen episodes. His portrayal of Samwell, a shy worm who becomes one of Jon Snow's closest friends, is a fan favorite. He also moved into voice acting with a role in a World of Warcraft expansion and gained a recurring role on Shameless. In 2006, English pop star Lily Allen wrote a song that played her younger brother Alfie to be a carefree layman. That difficult love for brothers must have worked because some years later Alfie passedSmall parts in movies such as the Atonement and the Other Girl Bolena to the main role of Theon Greyjoy in Game of Thrones. And now it's worth \$6 million. Dollars.no surprise that Allen became an actor: Her mother Alison was a film producer, while her father was a veteran television and film actor. Originally he auditioned for the role of Jon Snow, but accepted the role of Theon, a department of the iron islands taken in Ned Stark, and appeared in all eight seasons, he appeared in all eight seasons, he appeared in John Wick's first film and in the 2018 reboot of The Predator. Aidan Gillen is not a stranger to be in a show loved by HBO. From 2004 to 2008 he played the mayor of Baltimore Thomas Carcetti on The Wire. But it is his six seasons as Petyr "Littlefinger" Baelish, a character so conniving and manipulative that gives Cersei a race for his money, that most fans associate with the Irish actor, which is worth a \$8 million. Gillen, who grew up in Dublin, was nominated for a BAFTA in 2000 for his role as Stuart Jones in the BBC Queer as Folk series. His long stage career included a Tony nomination in 2004 for the drama Harold Pinter The Caretaker and told several Irish poetry and prose audiobooks. Jon Snow knows something: how to get paid. Harington graduated from the prestigious Central School of Speech and Drama in 2008 and spent several years playing on stage in London before landing the role of conflicts, but loyal, Jon Snow in 2010. Now, thanks to Game Of Thrones and more fashion approvals, Harington is estimated to be \$12 million. Like other cast colleagues, Harington saw his skyrocket per-episode at 500,000. (Not bad for someone who had never been on television before!) His growing popularity on the show helped him land other high-profile concerts, too. It is the voice of a charmingly shady Viking in the How To Train Your Dragon franchise and Emmy winners in the talented cast of Game of Thrones, but only one has a Silver Bear BestAward. Iain Glen, who plays the loyal confidant of Daenerys Ser Jorah Mormont, is worth an estimated \$6 million. The Scottish actor, who appears in all eight seasons of Game of Thrones, brought more than 20 years of scenic experience and screen to his role as Ser Jorah, a former misguided lord who helps Daenerys to fight his way through Westeros. He was also nominated for several prestigious theatrical awards, appeared in several episodes of Downton Abbey and got a recurring role in the Resident Evil franchise. When Clarke surrendered to play the fugitive Daenerys Targaryen in 2010, the British actress was far from being a family name. She had just graduated from the theater school in Central Saint Martins in London and her curriculum consisted mainly of theatrical performances and television roles and random films. Now, she is worth an estimated \$13 million and one of the world's largest stars. In the course of the show, Clarke raised his per-episode pay several times, and before the beginning of the seventh season, he signed an agreement with HBO worth a cool \$500,000 per episode. (No word on whether this includes CGI-dragon risk pay). In addition to the millions he made from the show, Clarke has signed lucrative agreements with leading fashion brands Dior and Dolce & Gabbana and has branched with leading roles in Terminator Genisys and Solo: Star Wars Story. Irish actor Liam Cunningham joined Game of Thrones in his second season as Davos Seaworth, a smuggler with a golden heart. Over the course of eight seasons, he became a fan favorite character. (It is a cry away from his early years that work as an electrician). After two decades, the award-winning actor is estimated at approximately \$4 million. It took a few years to Cunningham to pursue his dream ofbut in the middle of the 1990s he started working constantly in films like A Little Princess and appeared on differentTV series. He followed his award-winning performance in the 2008 Hunger film with high-profile films such as War Horse and Clash of the Titans, and won a BAFTA in 2011 for his debut feature film Pitch Black Heist. Like Sandor "The Hound" Clegane, the Scottish actor Rory McCann is one of the most cynical and compelling characters of the Game of Thrones. After passing a terrible climbing accident in the 1980s, McCann became famous in Scotland with a leading role in a breakfast advertising campaign. Now it appeared in almost every season of Game of Thrones and it is reported that it is worth almost \$6 million. McCann, who initially studied to be a painter, trained in a field of boot in the desert for the epic Alexander of Oliver Stone and showed his comic side in the satire Hot Fuzz of the companion-cop and the sitcom of the BAFTA The Book Group (which in part took inspiration from his well advertised incident). Since he joined the HBO show he also appeared in the Slow West drama and in the third film of the Xander Cage series. Maybe he knew him as the cynical bit player in 1995 indie cult hit Living in Oblivion, or his breakout role as the obsessed railroad Fin in The Station Agent. But the character who defines Peter Dinklage is now his Emmy-winning performance as Tyrion Lannister, which has contributed to increase his estimated value up to \$15 million. Dinklage had never read the books on which the show is based, but jumped to the chance to play Tyrion, whose intelligence and complotti appealed to him. In fact, he was the first actor to sign the show, and for the last two seasons he pulled in 500,000 an episode. When not plotting with a cup of wine in your hand, Dinklage can be seen in large screen blockbuster like X-Men: Days of the future past and Avengers: Infinity War. Carice van Houten starred in the most successful Dutch film ever, drama by Paul Verhoevenbook, but he took appear on game of thrones to make the award-winning Dutch actress worth a \$5 million reported. Van Houten, who joined the show in 2012 and remained a member of the main cast until he left the show in his final season, could also be familiar to the American public from his role in Font of Tom Cruise in Valkyrie. But while van Houten has been a candidate for his desire to work in Europe, he is a protagonist in the American productions Race and Incarnate, as did voiceover work for the Simpsons. Isaac Hempstead-Wright was only 11 years old and had acted only in a single spot when he was launched on Game of Thrones as Bran Stark, whose injury to the hands of Jaime Lannister has repercussions that turn over the years. It is one of the few major cast members to still be on display, and it is estimated that Wright is worth about \$4 million. An integral part of the first four seasons of the show, Wright returned to Season 6 and is a great player in the show, he appeared in several films and lent his voice to an episode of the animated series Family Guy. 40 years after his time in the British espionage series The Avengers and the 1969 Bond classic film On Her Majesty's Secret Service, actress Diana Rigg earned a new generation of fans with her role as imperious and striking Lady Olenna Tyrell. It was a third appropriate act for the critically acclaimed actress, whose value is estimated at \$10 million. Rigg received four Emmy nominations for his role as Olenna, whose sharp wit and barb-tongued bon mots earned her the nickname "The Queen of Thorns" and made her a highlight of the Kings Landing stories of the show. Like Tywin Lannister, Charles Dance has struck fear in the hearts of his sons Jaime, Cersei and Tyrion, as well as the audience around the world. It is an appropriate role for the British actor veteran who made his TV debut in 1974 and now is worth an estimate of \$5 million. Dance, who was appointed officer of the Order of the British Empire in 2006, joined Game of Thrones in 2011 and remained a key figure in several stories through Season 5. Since then he has appeared in the reboot of high-profile Ghostbusters and in 2018 television adaptation of John Le Carré's spy novel The Little Drummer Girl. Girl.

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
