Under 16, get 50 hours supervised practice driving, complete driver's education, and hold permit at least 12 months before taking road test. Usually no test required but examiner's discretion may vary. Have licensed supervisor (at least 3 years experience) with you during supervised driving with permit. To obtain a driver's license in North Dakota, residents should visit the North Dakota DOT website. A North Dakota driver's license is required for all state residents who own a vehicle. Non-residents, tourists, and non-citizen military personnel are exempt from this requirement. An individual is considered a resident after 90 days and can apply for an operator's license or instruction permit at the Department of Transportation's Drivers License Division. Required documents include proof of identity, social security card, and North Dakota residency. The age requirement for a driver's license is 16, while an instruction permit can be obtained at 14. To practice driving with an instruction permit, those under 18 must be accompanied by a licensed driver with at least three years of experience. To obtain an instruction permit, applicants must be 14 or older, sponsored by a parent or guardian, and pass a written and visual exam. Upgrading to a full operator's license requires completing a driver education course, 50 hours of supervised driving, and passing a road test. After passing the road test, minors can obtain a restricted license, which becomes unrestricted at age 16. The road test can be waived with a North Dakota Driving School Certificate or Department of Public Instruction Student Completion Certificate. No appointment is needed for the knowledge test, which requires proof of legal status, name and birthplace verification, and a federal identification number. For applicants under 18, parental or guardian approval is also required. To pass your knowledge test in North Dakota, focus on answering at least 20 out of 25 multiple-choice questions correctly. Ensure you have a valid North Dakota driver's license and the required Certificate of Training for Driver's Education if under 16.
