If you hold down the F key, you can chat with your friends by voice. Although you can hear your friends normally, you must hold down the “F” key to speak to them. Your audio will no longer be transmitted to other players once you release the “F” key. This is one of the best ways on how to voice chat in Rocket League.In the controllerBy default, your controller uses “RB” as the primary key to activate voice chat. If you press and hold RB you can talk to your friends for as long as you want. When you release this key like you would on a keyboard, your audio will no longer play to other players and teammates. This is a default way on how to voice chat in Rocket League.Change the default voice chat button/buttonJust follow the guide below to change your default voice chat key to a different one.Open Rocket League on your system and scroll down to select “Options”.Now click/tap on RB and navigate to “Controls”.Now click on “Show/edit bindings”.You will now see a list of all standard key combinations. Scroll down and look for Voice Chat.Click on “Voice Chat”. Now press the new key that you want to assign to “Voice Chat”. Your new key combination will now be saved automatically. You can now press the reassigned button during a game and chat with your teammates.Things to considerThe quick chat is visible to everyone. Teammates and opponentsText chat / written messages are only visible to players using the same platform as you. This means that PC players can only see text messages from other PC players.Cross-platform support for voice chat is currently missing. Psyonix plans to include it sometime in the future, but there is no information on this yet.The Epic Games version of Rocket League does not currently support voice chat.How to voice chat in Rocket League and Why is voice chat not available to me or does not work? Unfortunately, if you are a new user of Rocket League via Epic Games, you will be disappointed that the ability to chat with friends and family is not available in the game. This decision by Psyonix appears to be part of its transition, and the company is expected to roll out voice chat support in the coming weeks. Many experts believe that this limitation is due to the limited amount of server resources available to game developers.The Epic Games version of the game is free and has already attracted millions of users who must have had a huge impact on server space. To ensure the proper functioning of online servers, the developers seem to have chosen to implement these restrictions. But that doesn’t mean you can’t communicate with your friends and teammates during games. Let’s see how you can do that.Alternative solution on how to voice chat in Rocket League # 1: Use Text and Quick ChatI know, I know it’s not an ideal solution, but it’s the only native way within the Rocket League that you can use to communicate with every player in the game. It also has dedicated quick chat controls so you can message your opponents and teammates without having to type a full message. And for those times when you need to express yourself, you have the option to “chat”.By default, the text chat function is activated by pressing the “T” key. Like the Voice Chat button, it can be assigned to any button you want using the instructions above. Once you hit the assigned button, Rocket League will display a text chat box in the top left corner of your screen for you to type the message your heart desires.Alternative solution on how to voice chat in Rocket League # 2: Use a third-party serviceIf you want to keep using the voice chat feature in Rocket League, we recommend using a service like Discord. This way you can chat in real-time with your friends via voice or video chat and even share your game with them. You can also use Discord to build your community so you don’t have to interact with other Rocket League players. The downside to this solution is that you can only chat with other team members and players using Discord if they have already been added to your Discord. Here’s a clear guide that will get you up and running with Discord with Rocket League in no time.If you haven’t already, download Discord for your PC from this link and install it on your system. Once installed, double-click the icon to launch Discord.Once Discord has launched, you will be asked to log into your account. Sign in if you already have an account, or use the Create Account feature to create a new account.You will now log into Discord. First click on the “+” symbol in the left sidebar of your screen.On this screen, select the Games template.Now enter a name for your new server.When you’re done, click “Create” in the lower right corner of the dialogue box.Your game server has been created. Click “Invite Friends” to begin.You will now receive a temporary link that your friends can use to join your new server. Copy this link and send it using the communication method of your choice, either email or instant messaging.Once your friend clicks the link, they will be able to join your Discord server and should appear in the participant list on the tab on the far right of your Discord server window.Now click on “Games” in the left sidebar of your screen to join the language server. Ask your friends to do the same.You should now be logged in and able to chat with everyone. You can use the various controls below to use the Discord broadcast as you wish. Now you can just go back to the Rocket League and have a new party with your boyfriend. Then you should be able to chat with them while playing a game using Discord in the background.You can also click the Share icon in the lower-left corner of your screen to share the screen preview with everyone on your Discord server. This can be especially useful in high stakes games or personal tournaments where other participants want to catch up on your game as the Rocket League does not offer the ability to watch games. Rocket LeagueDo note that in a cross-play match, when there are players from other platforms, only other PC players can see your messages. Quick Chats, on the other hand, can be seen by all. This can come in especially handy during high stake matches or personal tournaments where other participants would love to catch up on your match as Rocket League does not offer the ability to spectate matches.
