Screen reader friendly page Who should take it? A PBSC student who will miss or has missed a regularly scheduled class test may be permitted to take an Out-of-Class test. The decision to allow the test is left to the instructor. Do I need an appointment? Yes. It is up to the student to make the appropriate arrangements for the test. Please check the Test Center Appointment page for testing availability. Is there a fee? Yes. The fee is \$5. Students with accommodations are excluded from the fee. Fee waivers are provided for students who missed a test due to jury duty, military duty, death of an immediate family member, college sponsored activity, hospitalization, illness, or religious, reasons. Documentation is required and must be presented at the Testing Center. What else do I need to know? Provide the Testing staff with the professor's last name, the course number, and which test you want to take. Check with your professor for information about your test, e.g., deadline date, time allowed, or authorized aids you should bring. Testing Center staff will adhere strictly to your professor's written instructions and deadline dates. They are not authorized to make any exceptions. Out-of-Class tests are administered during regular operating hours of the Testing Centers. Examinees should insure that there is sufficient time, as indicated by the Professor, to complete their exam prior to Test Center closing. Time waivers will not be granted within 30 minutes of closing time. All students will be required to relinquish their exams 15 minutes prior to the time the Testing Center is scheduled to close. Test Center personnel cannot transfer classroom materials, homework assignments, projects, etc., from the students to professor and vice versa. The purpose of placement examinations is to determine the individual's skill level and readiness. Results will be used to determine the need, if any, for developmental placement. Faculty advisors will also use the results in planning students' programs and classes. What if I fail the placement test? You can retake the exam, but you may have to pay a fee. What if I miss a test due to illness, death or an accident? A student who will miss or has missed a regularly scheduled class test may be permitted to take an Out-of-Class test. The decision to allow the test is left to the instructor. Fee waivers are provided for students who missed a test due to jury duty, military duty, death of an immediate family member, college sponsored activity, hospitalization, illness, or religious, reasons. Documentation is required and must be presented at the Testing Center. Screen reader friendly page Out-of-Class Exams Out-of-Class Testing is defined as any exam which is taken outside the normal class testing window or location. This applies to both Classroom and Online classes. A Palm Beach State student who will miss or has missed a regularly scheduled class exam may be permitted to take an Out-of-Class exam. Students are offered an opportunity to take an Out-of-Class exam in the test centers: They must be referred to a Palm Beach State test center by their professor. The professor must create the testing instructions in RegisterBlast. Students are required to pay a \$5 Out-of-Class test fee through Emarket prior to testing. Students registered with the Center for Student Accessibility (CSA) are excluded from the fee. This service is offered on an individual basis, only. Whole classes taking or retaking an exam, in one sitting or over a span of several days, do not qualify for Out-of-Class testing in a Palm Beach State test center. Test Centers only accept tests and test instruction forms from a professor or staff member (NOT student workers). Note: Online exams only with the exception of CSA accommodations. Students may take an exam at the PBSC Testing Center of their choice, provided the instructor has submitted the exam with instructions to the Testing Center. Testing Policies and Procedures Testing Policies and Procedures for Palm Beach State Faculty (2018-19) Waiver of Instructor Designated Test Time If students arrive at the Testing Center and do not have the full amount of time designated by the instructor they will be permitted to sign a Test Time Waiver Form and take their test in less time. The Test Time Waiver Form will be attached to the exam and returned to the instructor. Cut-off time for Test Time Waivers is 30 minutes before closing. Students must have made prior payment, completed the waiver form, and be checked in and seated no later than 30 minutes before closing in order to be allowed to waive their time. Test Center staff will not stay past the Test Center closing times as noted on the Waiver Form. Exam Retakes and Classroom Proctoring Exam Retakes - when a student is permitted to retake a test because the student did not do well the first time he/she took the test in the classroom. Classroom Proctoring - having an entire class take an exam in the Testing Center instead of in the classroom. Exam retakes and classroom proctoring are not the responsibility of the Testing Centers. Faculty must make other arrangements if allowing students to retake an exam. Electronic Devices - Cell Phones, Tablets, Laptops, eBooks, Calculators with internet access Electronic Devices - Cell Phones, Tablets, Laptops, eBooks, eReaders, Calculators with internet access, etc. - are not permitted in the Testing Centers for Out-of-Class or Distance Learning exams unless specified in the class syllabus that the device is required for the class and/or permitted to be used during testing. No modifications or downloads are permitted on the Testing Center computers. Faculty are aware that test security could be breached when using these devices. This test is required for application to Palm Beach State's Registered Nursing Program and Practical Nursing Program (LPN). It is a computer-based test. There is a \$30 proctoring fee and an additional exam fee that will be paid on the Evolve website on the day you take your exam. Please contact the Testing Center where you plan to take the HESI exam if you have any additional questions. Visit the Testing Center webpage to register for the test (the test can be taken at Belle Glade, Palm Beach Gardens, Boca Raton or Lake Worth campus' Testing Centers). Students can take the entire HESI exam every 61 days, for a maximum of 3 times a calendar year. [PBSC administers the entire exam (9 sections) or the math section only]. All Students Must Create a Student Evolve Account before arriving at the Testing Center: Test applicants are required to set up an Evolve account with the vendor, Elsevier. You should only create one Student Evolve account through Elsevier. If your information changes, just update your account. (You will need an active PBSC student email account to register.) After registering, an email with your user name and password will be sent to your student email account. This email will need to be printed and brought with you at the time of your test appointment. Students without an active Student Evolve Account will not be eligible to test.
