Some versions of the game (not the 2019 version) appear to limit the number of spaces that you can earn to five. If a team lands on a Control or Spin space they will take the corresponding action. Otherwise the teams turn will end. The red team correctly guessed three cards during the round. Because of this they were able to move their pawn forward three spaces. When a team lands on a Control space (white space with Spades symbol) they will play a Control round. The Descriptor(s) for the current team will take the next card from the stack and will look for the category that has the Spades symbol next to it. The green team is on a Control space. Based on the card that they drew, they will have to describe Little Red Riding Hood. They will then describe this word/phrase to the rest of the players including the other teams. The first team to shout out the correct answer will win the round. The winner of the round will get to take the next turn. If it was the team that initiated the Control round, the roles of Descriptor(s) and Guesser(s) will change. For their next turn they will use the categories marked with the spades symbol instead of a normal category. When a team lands on one of the Spin spaces, orange and red spaces that extend into the center of the board, due to guessing words/phrases correctly, they will get to spin the spinner. The yellow team moved to a red space. They will get to spin the spinner and take the corresponding action. Depending on what they spin they may get to take a special action. Wide Green Section: You can move your piece forward two spaces or another teams piece back two spaces. Narrow Green Section: You can move your piece forward three spaces or another teams piece back three spaces. Red or Orange Section: No special action is taken. If the spinner lands on two different sections, you will spin again to determine what action is taken. When moving other teams pieces you can never move them back past the start space. When a team reaches or passes the finish space they will have a chance to win the game. The Descriptor(s) will take the next card and everyone will play a Control round. If the team that reached the finish space wins the round, they will win the game. The red team has reached the finish space. If they are able to win the Control round they will win the game. If the team that reached the finish space didnt win the round, the game will continue like normal. On their next turn the team will play another Control round in order to try and win the game. OBJECT OF THE GAME To be the first team to move from the START to the FINISH segment on the board. Progress is made by correctly guessing the phrases your team mates are describing. PREPARING TO PLAY Lay out the board and the card box. Players divide into teams of two or more. The more players per team the better. If for example there are eight players, two teams of four is better than four teams of two. Each team selects one playing piece and puts it on the START square. The team with the youngest player starts. HOW TO PLAY DESCRIBERS & GUESSEES Each turn team members are nominated as DESCRIBERS and GUESSEES. All players MUST take their turn at being DESCRIBERS. No matter how big the team, there are never more than two DESCRIBERS. Teams of 2 players have: 1 DESCRIBER and 1 GUESSEER. Teams of 3 players or more have: 2 DESCRIBERS and the rest are GUESSEES. Advanced players may wish to have only ONE DESCRIBER per turn whatever the team size. Decide this at the start of the game. PLAYING A TURN Play begins when the timer is turned over. The DESCRIBERS take the card from the front of the pack and start to describe the phrase whose colour matches the segment on which the teams playing piece is sitting. When a team member shouts out the correct answer the DESCRIBERS quickly take another card and repeat the process, using the SAME category. They keep doing this until the timer runs out, ending the turn. The DESCRIBERS count the number of cards that were correctly guessed and move their playing piece forward that many segments. Play passes on to the next team. DESCRIBERS must be careful not to break any of the DESCRIPTION RULES (see below). If they break one of these rules, they forfeit the turn. CONTROL SEGMENTS When a team lands on a white CONTROL segment, play does not pass to the next team. Instead the DESCRIBERS who have just been describing take another card and describe the phrase marked to EVERYBODY playing. There is NO TIME LIMIT. Play passes to the team that shouts out the right answer first. If the same team wins a second turn, the DESCRIBERS must change. During this turn the CONTROL phrases on the cards are used. After the CONTROL turn is over play passes to the next team as if that had been a normal turn. WINNING When a team reaches or passes the FINISH segment, the DESCRIBERS must take another card and describe the CONTROL phrase on it to all the players on all the teams. TO WIN, their team must be the first to guess it correctly. If another team guesses it first, the playing team must wait until their next turn to try again; this happens again and again each turn until they win OR another team arrives at the FINISH and wins by getting their final CONTROL question right before anyone else. DESCRIPTION RULES Reasonable variation in a Phrase: There are many instances of a Phrase being very similar to, but not exactly what it says on the card, bright as a button instead of as bright as a button or a cat make a silk purse from a sows ear rather than a silk purse from a sows ear. In these instances, be sensible and if the guesser has guessed even if it is not exactly as it is on the card, please accept it as correct. Key Words: During the description of a phrase there will be certain key words that are central to explaining the phrase. For example, in describing, a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush, key words would be, bird, hand, two, worth and bush. During the description key words cannot be used but it is OK to use simple words like, a, the, and or in despite their inclusion in the phrase. A certain amount of common sense is required here please. When describing you MUST NOT: Say what letter any of the words starts with, or how many letters any words have. Say any key words or any derivative, e.g. if post is a key word you may not say postage or postman; for swim you may not say swimmer and so on. Use rhymes with or sound like type clues. Be reasonable about using key words, they will certainly be tough on you. When describing YOU MAY: Gesticulate, act, mime (NOT mouth any word). Choose to PASS and not play a card BUT ONLY ONCE each turn. Perhaps less experienced players may be granted an unlimited PASS to, level the playing field (to coin a Phrase).
