The National Pokédex is a comprehensive list of all the Pokémon in existence. With over 1,000 species to date, it serves as a database for every Pokémon creature's stats and characteristics. ### Stat Explanation Each Pokémon has several key stats that affect its performance in battle. These include: - **HP (Hit Points)**: A Pokémon's life force, which determines how much damage it can withstand before fainting. - **Speed**: The order in which a Pokémon makes the first move in battle, often critical in long battles. - **Attack** and **Special Attack**: Measure the strength of moves used by your Pokémon, directly impacting damage dealt to opponents. - **Defense** and **Special Defense**: Reflect the ability to withstand attacks from other Pokémon. ### Generation Information The National Pokédex is divided into sections based on generation. Each generation has introduced new species of Pokémon, with the first generation including 151 Pokémon. The list continues to grow with each subsequent generation. ### Data Format Each entry in the National Pokédex includes: - **Pokémon number**: A unique identifier for each Pokémon. - **Party sprite**: An image representing the Pokémon's party form. - **Name** and **Japanese name**: Official names of each Pokémon. - **Types**: Listings of all the types associated with a Pokémon, including alternate forms that have different types. There are currently 1025 known species of Pokémon. Each Pokémon can be captured by weakening it and storing it in a Poké Ball. The original list of 151 Pokémon from the Kanto region's National Pokédex has been followed by numerous generations of new Pokémon. Initially, Bulbasaur held the #1 spot in the National Pokédex as the first partner Pokémon. Mew, considered an ancestor of all Pokémon, was listed at #151, right after its powerful counterpart Mewtwo at #150. The introduction of the Kanto Pokédex in Generation I provided information on these initial 151 Pokémon. Subsequent generations saw a steady increase in the number of introduced Pokémon: - Generation II brought about 100 new additions - Generation III added another 135 new Pokémon to the mix - Generation IV introduced 107 new species, expanding the collection further - Generation V brought forth 156 new additions - Generation VI witnessed the introduction of 72 new Pokémon - Generation VII contributed an additional 88 new species - Generation VIII saw the addition of 96 more Pokémon - Generation IX added a total of 112 new members to the ever-growing roster Given text here
