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Watson and his assistant taught Albert to be terrified of white mice. They used Pavlovian conditioning (classic), coupling a neutral stimulus (the rat) with a negative effect. Every time Albert reached one of the mice, they created a terrifyingly noisy noise right behind the 11-month-old. Not only did Albert very quickly learn to fear white mice, crying and walking away every time he saw one, but he also started crying in the presence of other hairy animals and a Santa mask with a white beard. White rats, a person's fear of dogs is most likely a conditioned response. Maybe he was bitten by a dog when he was three. Twenty years later, the person's brain (the amygdala in particular) still associates the sight of a dog with the pain of a bite. We will look more closely at some common fears in the next section.
