Fury's (34-1-1, 24 KOs) WBC and lineal titles to become undisputed heavyweight champion was in 2000 (Lennox Lewis, three-belt era). In a fight that turned in the ninth round, when Usyk nearly ended the bout and scored a knockdown, two judges scored the bout 115-112 and 114-113 for Usyk, while the third
had it 114-113 for Fury. Both fighters opened the fight with an active jab, but Usyk dictated the pace and had the more significant shots in the first two rounds, catching Fury with a looping left hook late in Round 1 and beginning the second round with a solid two-punch combination. Usyk continued to press forward in the third round, but Fury began
to find a rhythm, throwing more combinations and landing good body shots despite fighting off his back foot. He stayed busy behind his jab and set up a hard right uppercut early in the fourth round, and dug in a hard right hand to the body that made Usyk back up. A big right uppercut stunned Usyk in Round 6, visibly hurting him and causing him to
cover up momentarily. Fury looked to get into a groove, bouncing on his feet and taunting Usyk while pumping sharp jabs. Fury connected with another hard right uppercut that made Usyk back up in the seventh round, but Usyk kept coming, popping Fury with a straight right hand and finishing the round with a combination. Usyk showed his heart
and struck back in the eighth, scoring with a three-punch combination and forcing Fury to back up into the ropes after a big overhand left. Another big two-punch combination connected for Usyk, and he stunned Fury with a looping right hand in the closing seconds of the round, as swelling began to develop below Fury's right eye. Pelham/Getty ImagesUsyk seemed to be reinvigorated to open Round 9, which was a pivotal one for the Ukrainian. He returned to pressuring Fury and connected flush with a big left hand with Fury against the ropes. A huge left hand had Fury in trouble, and Usyk sensed that Fury was hurt and went for the finish, connecting with several hard
combinations. Fury was visibly hurt staggered against the ropes, and the referee ruled a knockdown as the bell sounded to end the round. Usyk backed Fury against the corner as Round 10 opened. Fury still appeared to be dazed from the punishment he took in the previous round, but Usyk stayed patient instead of opening up his attack. Usyk started
aggressively in the 11th round and kept pressing forward. He caught Fury with another hard left hand to the chin, and closed the round with a definitive performance against George Kambosos Jr., stopping him in the eighth round to retain the
IBF world title. With the victory, Hitchins solidifies his spot as ESPN's No. 2 junior welterweight, and the gap is closing between him and ESPN's No. 1 140-pounder, Teofimo Lopez, who was ringside for the fight. Following Hitchins's win, he and Lopez teased a potential unification fight in the future. As for Kambosos, he falls out of the top 10 with a
second consecutive knockout loss and a 2-4 record in his past six fights. Undefeated Andy Hiraoka enters at No. 10. Andy Cruz's one-sided demolition of Hironori Mishiro on the Hitchins vs. Kambosos undercard helps him hold his spot as the No. 6 lightweight. He's likely to face No. 7 Raymond Muratalla next for the IBF lightweight title. Cruz, a 2020
Olympic gold medalist, is looking to secure a world title in under 10 pro fights. Former unified junior bantamweight debut on June 14, and lands at No. 6 in the rankings for his new weight class. Nonito Donaire, 42, also made his return to the bantamweight division
with a technical decision over Andres Campos to secure a shot at the winner of Antonio Vargas and Daigo Higa's WBA title clash on July 30. star of Friday's Netflix hit. Just like their first encounter two years ago, Taylor won via a disputed decision with demands for another instalment. If there are doubts about who should have won, there is no arguing about the quality of the fight which ended in a savage slugfest. In front of a potentially eye-popping audience built from Netflix's 282 million
subscribers, undisputed junior welterweight champion Taylor (24-1, 6 KOs) earned scores of 95-94 on all three judges' scorecards in the rematch which was chief support to YouTuber-turned-boxer Jake Paul points win over 58-year-old former world heavyweight champion Mike Tyson at AT&T Stadium, Arlington. Taylor vs. Serrano II lived up to
expectations, but the judges' scorecards controversially did not reward Serrano's accuracy or work rate. Despite setting a CompuBox statistics record of 324 punches landed by a female boxer, it was not enough for Serrano (47-3-1, 31 KOs) to earn the judges' decisions. The New York-based Puerto Rican overcame a significant disadvantage of stepping
up three weight classes to outland and wobble Taylor, while contending with a gruesome cut above her right eye caused by a clash of heads in Round 4. Taylor, 38, once again was left answering questions about whether she thought she deserved to beat Serrano, 36, who complained about the result and the headbutts. "She kept headbutting me," said
Serrano, who is world champion in a staggering seven weight divisions. "We knew from the first fight it's what she does. Not only my fight, she did it with Champion, claimed her purse was even bigger than the $6.1 million Taylor reportedly got paid for their
rematch, and there is no bigger fight for her now than a trilogy encounter with Taylor, who beat Serrano by a split decision in New York in April 2022 in their first encounter. either at an outdoor venue in Ireland like Croke Park or in Saudi Arabia. Promoters have been frustrated at previous attempts to stage Taylor at Croke Park, which could hold more than 82,000, and with Saudi Arabia now pouring money into boxing to bring the best fights to Riyadh, don't be surprised if Taylor vs. Serrano ends up somewhere other
than Ireland or the United States. The controversy surrounding the decision takes some of the gloss off Taylor's 18th world-title fight victory, and will only increase pressure on her to face Serrano next year for a third time. An indication of how the fight would unfold was clear early on when Serrano's landed a beautiful left hand on Taylor's jaw that
rocked the Bray-born star back onto the ropes. Serrano followed up with a right that left Taylor looking shaken. Southpaw Serrano ended the round with blood smeared over her face from a cut above her right eye caused by a clash of heads, but was still
able to plant a cheeky left hook on Taylor on the bell. Serrano's gaping cut caused her problems in Round 6 as Taylor enjoyed more success and she landed a sharp right hook at close range. There was a furious exchange in Round 7, with Serrano landing 54 punches to Taylor's 35, according to CompuBox. Amanda Serrano endured a significant cut

Taylor was docked a point in Round 8 for use of the
head, which Serrano's corner felt aggrieved about all fight. "I certainly wasn't fighting dirty, sometimes it gets rough in there," Taylor, who lives and trains in Connecticut, said. "We put on an amazing show."The decision was booed, but this was a fabulous advert for women's professional boxing and inspirational for the next generation of female
boxers despite the contentious nature of the ruling. decision in an eight-round heavyweight match at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, on Friday. All three judges scored the fight for Paul, 80-72, 79-73 and 79-73. The fight, sanctioned by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation, was contested at 2-minute rounds, and both fighters wore 14-ounce gloves instead of the regular 10-ounce gloves
for heavyweight fights. Tyson, 58, and Paul, 27, the YouTuber-turned-boxer, were scheduled to meet on July 20, but the fight was postponed after Tyson received medical attention during a flight from Miami to Los Angeles in May for an ulcer flare-up. Tyson (50-7, 44 KOs) became the youngest heavyweight champion at age 20 in 1986, and a year later
he had unified all three major belts to become undisputed champion. He made six defenses of the three belts until losing in a historic upset to James "Buster" Douglas by 10th-round KO in February 1990. Paul (11-1, 7 KOs) started his boxing career in 2020 with six consecutive victories fighting mostly against former MMA fighters. Paul's only loss
came against Tommy Fury in February 2023, but he has won five straight fights, including the decision over Tyson, since.
