 \tilde{A} , keyword index abides the classic Greek writers used the word less meaning, "to stay, $\tilde{A} \notin \hat{a}$, $\neg \$ "fast stand, $\tilde{A} \notin \hat{a}$, $\neg \$ "abident." He has the idea of staying at home, or be where you are and don't wander. The word translated "Abide" is one of the favorite words of the Apostle John. He uses him 34 times in the Gospel and 19 times in the letters of him. The word less means to dwell in your home, to stay as a quest in someone's home, to respect or support uninterrupted communion with someone. To have a friend who suffers is always present to help you in time of need. The Apostle John uses it to say that God "respects" (less) in Christ. He dwells in him and therefore has a constant influence on him. The divine presence is continuously operational in him. Jesus said, "I am in the father is in me, and I in his father." It's like Jesus do you do what he does? He was: "The father who was doing the job of him." Jesus is the only person who was completely available to his father. He told his disciples, "believe me that I am in the father, and the father is in me" was the perfect character of him. Jesus was different and you can see the difference in the behavior of him. He spoke what the father told him to say (14:10; see 7:16; 12: 49-50; 14:24). Jesus not only said what the father who suffered in me, does the works of him" (v.10). "The father who lives in me ... he is doing the job of him" and the trials are what you see. In John 14:20 Jesus took the idea of a relationship more forward when he spoke of the Holy Spirit and the believer. "He won't leave you as orphans; he will come from you. After a while while the world you won't make me anymore; but You will see me; because I live, you will live too. In that day you will know that I am my father, and you in me, and I in you "(John 14: 18-20). When Jesus said that believers "respect" in God, draws a report linked to him from the Holy Spirit who received when they believer. In the first epistle of John, the apostle says that this vital union to remain in Christ will make the difference in our behavior. What he says that dwells (remains or resides) in God should walk just like Jesus walked. Less indicates a narrow, intimate and permanent relationship between the believer and God (1 John 2: 6, 24, 27, 3: 6). Furthermore, "really, really, I tell you, the one who believes in me, the works I do, will do it too; and more work of these will do it; because I go to the father" (14:12). "Whatever you ask for something in my name, I will. If you love me, you will keep my commandments "(VVV. 13-15). Jesus is not talking about fantastic spectacular miracles, but the preaching of the Gospel. The great works "are the good news of Jesus Christ and His saving work towards the ends of the Earth and seeing a great harvest of souls. The preaching of the Pentecost day is an excellent example of these "works". When we serve him according to his will Our prayers, and we can see him do great and powerful things inside and through us. He wants us to make it available to him even if he gave himself to his father. We must ask what Jesus would ask the Father the Holy Spirit who deserves you in us to guide us. The limits of the promise of prayer are the intimate union and harmony with Christ who will not be asked for anything available for his will. The Apostle John says in this vital union with Christ, Christ or God lives in the believer (John 6:56, 15: 4). It is an intimate person, to the relationship with him, for Jesus says he lives in us. "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood dwells in me and in him" (6:56). We have adapted that the respectful relationship of faith. Jesus said: "I live in them." It occupies a place in us as its dwelling. It is a permanent relationship with my soul and exercises its power and authority over my life. The inhabitant presence of Christ in the believer is his permanent residence in him and his supply that is necessary to produce fruit in his life. Again, this is the work of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit and the Spirit of Christ refer to the same person. John 15: 4, "Respect me, and I in you, while the branch does not bear fruit of itself, unless you respect me." The screw is our positional source. "Continues to stay in me." Jesus is emphasizing the permanence of position as the maintenance of uninterrupted communion and communion with the person in whom he lives. He's saying, "Remain united to me." †œRemain in uninterrupted Fellowship with me. Î the believer keeps communion uninterrupted with Christ. It's a holy bag. There is no better analogy than the vine and its branches. The believer draws his spiritual life and energy from the wearer. We stick to Christ and him in us when we enter into a personal relationship by putting our trust in him as our Saviour. You've settled in your personal life? (6: 54-58) You are continuing to persevere in his(8:31; 1 John 2:19, 24). Are you obeying him commandments? (15: 9-10) We cannot produce spiritual fruit it will carry to God without a continual residue in him. We cannot produce the kind of fruit of God without the life of God within us. The remaining ones in him bear fruit. Usual principles and practical applications 1. When God invites us to come and join Him in what He is doing, it is an invitation to an intimate personal relationship with Him. We are to him as a branch is to his vine. If we want to bear his kind of fruit, it has to be related to him. We can do nothing but draw our strength from him (John 15: 5). 2. When we produce quality spiritual fruit, it depends entirely on the life of Christ reproduced in the believer. There are no short cuts of fruit (Galatians 5:22-23; Hebrews 12:11). The "fruit" Jesus expects them to be acts of love that demonstrate our relationship with God. Jesus does not expect us to work to gain God's favor, but evidences of life in the branches. 3. "Who hath separated us from the love of Christ?" "Nobody", thunders the apostle Paul in Romans 8:35-39. Our abode in Christ does not depend on us, but on making ourselves available to him. The Holy Spirit dwells in the believer forever (John 14:16). The problem in chapter fifteen is about our relationship with God in the fruit of the bearing. Salvation is not the subject. 4. If we are respecting in Christ, we will have a rich prayer life that supplies rich fellowship with him (14:13-14; 15:7, 16). 5. When we walk as Christ, I always wait for us close to Christ. Christ's closeness always invites us to come and enter into uninterrupted communion with him. What makes a man "holy" is the perpetual indwelling of the Holy Spirit within him. We become like the ones we associate with. 6. To dwell in continual dependence on Christ is to keep oneself in the position of trust-like-trust and dependence on thim. 7. Jesus said he could do nothing by himself. So we can't do anything alone. Everything about respecting means that we must remain united with him just as the son remains united with the Father.
