


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## Ap testing 2024

Read on for everything we know so far about the 2024 AP Exams.Is there anything different about the 2024 AP Exams?The 2024 AP Exams will follow the same general format as the 2023 paper-and-pencil exams: All 2024 AP Exams will be held in-school with initial test times spread over the first two weeks in May.Digital AP Exam SubjectsAP Computer Science Principles AP English Language AP English Literature AP European History AP Seminar AP U.S. History AP World History AP African American Studies (2023-24 pilot schools only)It will be up to your school to determine whether you take a digital exam, a paper-and-pencil exam, or have the option of both.If your school offers digital AP Exams, they will be administered at your school under the same conditions and schedule as the paper-and-pencil exams. The format, number of questions, types of questions, and timing of the digital exams will be the same as paper exams. Read more about the 2024 Digital AP Exams here.Where will I take my AP Exam?All AP Exams are to be taken in person, in students' schools.When will I take my AP Exam?Each subject's exam will occur at a set local time, so some students taking the same exam may not take them simultaneously. For example, while a student who lives on the east coast will take her paper-and-pencil AP U.S. History Exam at 8:00 AM EDT, a student who lives on the west coast would take his AP U.S. History Exam at 8:00 AM PDT, three hours later. The same applies to international students.What if I have a scheduling conflict?If you are taking more than one AP Exam, and two of those AP Exams are scheduled at the same time, your AP Coordinator will be able to register you for a late testing date. AP Computer Science Principles students to submit their Create performance task as final.Friday, May 10, 2024 (8 p.m. ET), is the deadline for:AP Art and Design students to submit their three portfolio components as final in the AP Digital Portfolio.How much is the AP Exam?For on-time exam orders (by November 15, 2023, for full-year and first-semester courses; by March 15, 2024, for courses that start after November 15), the cost is \$98 per exam at schools in the U.S., U.S. territories, Canada, and all DoDEA schools. The fee is \$123 per exam at schools everywhere else. Some in financial need may be eligible for a reduction in the price of the exam. An AP Exam tests how well students understand the material on their corresponding AP course. Each exam, varying by topic, is a rigorous test that gives students a great topic to focus on when building their applicant profile. These exams take place in May – students can find their specific AP Exam schedule 2024 for each subject in the post below. Eric Rothenmel / Unsplash / "white printer paper" / Unsplash license Most of the 2024 AP Exams will be taken in schools (not at home) using pencil and paper, and take place over a two-week period. The AP Chinese and AP Japanese exams are exceptions and will be taken on school computers. The AP exams start their first week on May 6th – 10th, 2024 and go on through May 13th – 17th, 2024 for the second week. When looking at the start times, keep in mind that exams can be started up to 1 hour after the posted start time. For instance, the afternoon exams could begin anytime between 12 – 1 PM local time. Some exceptions exist. For example, AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism exams began between 2-3 PM during the regular exam schedule. Many AP courses have portfolios, which must be turned in digitally for College Board to grade. These portfolios will be submitted and uploaded on a secure web application. Taking AP courses and preparing for the corresponding exams can be tough since the subject matter goes above the normal high school level. However, colleges then know that you went deeper into a certain subject, especially if it relates to your major, and it also exposes you to college-level material in that subject. And of course, scoring a 4 or 5 on an AP exam will improve your applicant profile. It shows that you were strong enough academically to master a tough class and score well in a challenging AP exam. This effect will be greater if the AP course and exam is related to what major you are applying for, because it shows your strength in the subject matter of that major. If you don't score well on one or more AP exams, don't fret – deciding to take these exams (and getting scores back) won't be directly submitted to the colleges you apply to. You can choose not to report your scores on your college application if your score is low. Besides having high AP scores improve your admissions odds, there are many other benefits of taking these exams. Some are listed below. Some colleges and universities award scholarships to students who perform well on AP exams. These could help cut down your college costs. Additionally, passing these exams (especially getting a 4+) could earn you college credit at some universities, saving you time and money since you do not need to take certain introductory courses. You could even graduate earlier by scoring well on multiple exams. These exams can familiarize you with college-level coursework, and you may find it easier to make the academic transition into college due to your AP exam preparation. Even students who get a 1 or 2 on their AP exam still tend to do better in the college equivalent and are more familiar with the content than students who never took the related AP course or test. These exams can also help you determine what your academic strengths and weaknesses are in terms of your personal difficulty with each exam, which can help you whittle down your majors or career paths. The AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism Exam in Alaska must begin between 1 and 2 pm. Digital Portfolio Due Date The deadline to submit for AP Art and Design digital portfolios is May 10th at 8 pm ET. How Do AP Exams Impact Your College Chances? Top colleges are looking to admit students who are intellectually curious and who challenged themselves in high school with rigorous coursework. The more selective the school you're applying to, the more beneficial AP classes are. At Ivy League schools and Top-30 colleges, it's common for admitted students to have completed upwards of 12 AP classes. Many high-ranking colleges use a tool known as the Academic Index to facilitate admissions decisions. Academic Index is a representation of your entire academic performance by a single numerical score, and failure to meet a school's threshold can lead them to deem you unqualified for admission. AP classes will help boost your Academic Index and improve the odds that your application will receive serious consideration. It even recommended that students submit their portfolios to their teachers well in advance of this date. AP exams play a less significant role in college admissions than the AP classes themselves. However, they can make a difference, particularly at super-selective schools. For example, scoring a bunch of 5s could help you stand out from other academically talented applicants. Conversely, a handful of 1s or 2s could lead a top-flight school to question your academic acumen. Luckily, AP scores are self-reported, and you're under no obligation to submit subpar scores. Start Early Like any other exam, you'll want to avoid waiting until the last minute to begin studying for your AP exams. Consistency is key—start with regular review sessions and ramp up as you get closer to the test. Creating a study schedule can help you carve out time to study, keep you on track to an enviable exam score, and ensure you have time for other important activities. Practice Makes Perfect One of the best ways to prepare for an AP exam is by taking practice exams. Practice exams not only test your knowledge of a subject, but also help you become familiar with how the tests are structured, formatted, and timed. The closer you can simulate the real test, the better—so find a quiet place, remove distractions, and get to work. You can find numerous great free practice tests and resources available online. Strengthen Weaknesses Another benefit of practice tests is that they illuminate areas that need improvement. Knowing your weaknesses allows you to make the most of your study time and focus your attention on areas in which you may be underperforming. Don't go overboard, though! It's also important to remain confident in your strengths. Study Strategy Some simple, strategic test-taking can make the difference between a good and great score. For example: There is no guessing penalty on the AP exams, so it behooves you to answer every question. Write something even if you don't know the answer to a free-response question, there's no penalty for guessing and almost anything is better than leaving the page blank. You can answer AP exam questions in any order, so go through and answer the easy questions first then go back to the harder, more time-consuming questions. Take a Break You can only study for so long and there is only so much information you can retain before you burn out. Pencil in a few breaks on your study schedule and take some time away from your notes, textbooks, and tests. Also, try to get a good night's sleep—research shows that the more sleep students get, the better their grades are. The Power of Positivity Stressing over your AP exams will only do more harm than good. Keep a positive attitude and trust that your preparation will pay off. Remember, even if you don't score that coveted 5 on your AP English Language and Composition exam, you don't have to submit the score to the colleges you're applying to. Good luck! Passing an AP exam is an excellent way for students to showcase their academic accomplishments and ability to handle rigorous coursework. It speaks to a student's ability to thrive in advanced educational settings and can be another way for students to stand out from the competition during the college admissions process. AP courses were designed by the College Board and are meant to replicate college-level coursework. As such, AP classes are more rigorous than high school-level courses. AP exams test students on a year's worth of content. The College Board has a set syllabus for each AP exam and will test students over that knowledge regardless of if they covered that material with their instructor. AP Exam Schedule 2024 AP exams function like a final exam for the course and, as such, are only offered in May. For the 2023-2024 academic year, schools will administer them from May 6 to 10 and May 13 to 17. Students must submit their AP Seminar, Computer Science Principles, and Research digital portfolios by 11:59 p.m. ET on April 30, 2024. AP Art and Design students have until 8:00 p.m. ET on May 10, 2024. While the College Board lists specific exam start times, they allow some deviation based on local needs. Generally, schools have a one-hour window to start administering the tests. Additionally, late testing is an option if circumstances beyond the student's or school's control prevent students from taking the exam as scheduled. Late fees aren't usually incurred if the reasons are valid. While some AP exams are going digital, most are still traditional paper and pencil exams. It's up to the school district to determine if they will offer a digital version of the eight exams currently available in a digital and traditional format. The College Board is offering digital exams for the following programs: AP Computer Science Principles AP English Language and Composition AP English Literature and Composition AP European History AP Seminar AP U.S. History AP World History: Modern AP African American Studies (2023-24 pilot schools only) Schools offering digital exams must conduct these exams in a separate room than those taking the traditional version of the same exam. These rooms must have separate proctors so students can take the digital exam at the same time as those taking the paper exam. When Should I Expect My AP Scores? While the exact dates for 2024 haven't been set, students can typically expect their AP exam results in July. Students will be able to report exam scores to their intended colleges on their application. Some colleges may ask for an official score report, but most allow students to self-report prior to admission. The College Board can send these scores to colleges on behalf of the student. Students can have their scores sent to one school for free, however these scores can be sent to additional schools for a fee. If a student doesn't achieve their desired score, they may retake the exams the following year. High school freshmen, sophomores, and juniors may choose to retake their exams the following year to earn a higher score. What is the Best Way to Prepare for AP Exams?
